While details for this year's commemoration have yet to be announced, Kristallnacht (the Night of Broken Glass) was a campaign against Jews carried out by the Nazi paramilitary forces along with civilians throughout Nazi Germany on **9–10 November** 1938. It is commemorated in Perth at around this time each year.


The name Kristallnacht comes from the shards of broken glass that littered the streets after the windows of Jewish-owned stores, buildings and synagogues were smashed.


